There is no 'one size fits all' when it comes to the work being done by Communities to reawaken, nurture and grow Languages. We will take a place-based approach to work alongside and invest in Aboriginal Communities so that their Language needs and aspirations can be realised.

We will work with Aboriginal Communities and government and non-government sectors to find solutions to these challenges.
